PRESS RELEASE - August 6th, 2013:

1. **Misdemeanor -Domestic Disorderly Conduct:** On August 1st, 2013, at approximately 10:33 AM, Patrolman Jeff Vaughn responded to 200 Shannock Village Road, Shannock, and arrested **David Gregoire**, age 34, of apartment B at that address, on the strength of an outstanding Richmond Police affidavit and arrest warrant charging him with (1) **Domestic - Refusal to Relinquish Telephone (cell phone)**, (2) **Domestic - Disorderly Conduct**, and (3) **Domestic - Vandalism**. The charges stem from an investigation by Patrolman John Randall into a domestic disturbance at the above address on July 21st, 2013, at approximately 3:40 AM, in which Mr. Gregoire engaged in a heated diatribe against a female victim. When she attempted to call the police on her cellular phone, Mr. Gregoire allegedly grabbed it from her and smashed it on the ground, and then picked it up and threw it into the woods before fleeing the scene. Mr. Gregoire was processed at the station, and was subsequently transported to 4th District Court where he was arraigned on the above charges. The court issued a No-Contact Order, and remanded him to the Adult Correctional Institution after Mr. Gregoire was unable to post the requisite surety bail amount.
2. **FELONY - Desecration of Places of Public Assemblage:** On August 6th, 2013, at approximately 9:55 AM, Sergeant Michael Lawing arrested **Mary Russo**, age 48, of no permanent address, Richmond, on charges of (1) **Desecration of Places of Public Assemblage**, (2) **Disorderly Conduct**, and (3) **Malicious Damage**, moments after she had walked into the front foyer/lobby area that is shared by the Richmond Police Department and the Richmond Community Center (Richmond Senior Center) at 1168 Main Street, Wyoming, and poured a pungent smelling liquid substance (containing urine), onto the floor near the entry to the stairwell for the Community Center. After pouring the substance, she immediately ran away from the scene, and was apprehended near the CVS on Main Street. Ms. Russo's actions were captured on surveillance video, and were observed by an eyewitness. The substance, considered a bio-hazardous material, required professional cleaning services. Ms. Russo was processed at the station, and was subsequently transported to 4th District Court where she was arraigned on the above charges. She was ordered held without bail pending a bail status conference August 14th, and a subsequent probation violation hearing on August 21st.
